- **DES – Digital Education Services**

If you are looking for assistance with ITV/ETV video-based FREE resources, look to your local DES professional! DES personnel for each district are working with educators in their schools to bring the digital world into their classrooms. Go to www.scetv.org/education/des for information or look for contact list in back of ITV Link.

- **OnePlaceSC**

With this ETV Web portal, educators have a single sign on, providing time-saving searches across many quality K–12 educational sites, including all of ETV's Web content, ITV and DISCUS sites. The TV Guide feature shows all of ETV's satellite and broadcast programming.

- **IP Delivery**

Instead of broadcast TV, approximately two-thirds of our districts now have IP delivery to stream live video and record a minimum of 4 channels, including ITV, ETV, the SC Channel, and local district programming. DES personnel can schedule and record educational content much like with a digital video recorder.

- **StreamlineSC**

Over 1,650 ITV and ETV programs are available online in *StreamlineSC*. These resources are marked with "SL" in the Curriculum Overview sections and in the description sections of the *ITV Link* and online *ITV Resources* book. We continue to add more programs and teacher's guides!

- **Educator+**

Open source streaming site where a variety of professional development series and programs created by SCDE and other programming can be accessed. Look for link on ITV home page.

Join SCDE's Jennifer Brown for a special program produced this summer. Lemira Elementary in Sumter District 17 has a student population that is 96% free and reduced lunch and 88% African American. When your entire population is made up of two historically underachieving subgroups, it is essential to look beyond traditional teaching methods. Since 2004, Lemira has been using a literacy coaching model and best practices to improve teaching and accelerate student achievement—one teacher and one student at a time. The balance of long-term professional development with changes in classroom practices is ensuring significant growth for Lemira students. Change-over-time data will be shared.

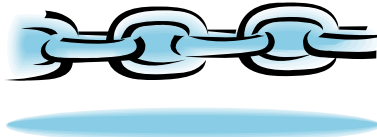

aboUt: 4 HEALTH-E Teens

Grades 5-12 4 lessons 27 minutes Health/Physical Activity

Dr. Gariane Gunter, psychiatry fellow and Mrs. United States 2008, talks with teens about eating smart and moving more. Student-produced videos introduce topics and a health expert provides facts about health, nutrition and physical activity as teens share with peers. Program four addresses eating disorders.

*Almost Invisible: Black Patriots in the American Revolution

Grades 3-8 5 lessons 5 minutes Social Studies

SC Illustrator/Author Kate Salley Palmer's artwork and historical stories come to life in these programs about little-known Black Patriots in the American Revolution. With a narrator and sound effects, ITV dramatized stories using Palmer's original artwork.

Career Clusters

Grades 6-12 2 lessons 35–47 minutes Career Guidance

These programs are presented by Dave Walker, Director of the Regional Career Specialists. ***Career Clusters: What it takes...What it makes...and Guess who has done it?*** provides information on what it takes to get/do a job and you can make in certain jobs. ***Career Clusters: Show Me the Money*** talks about salary levels of jobs in each career cluster.

Celebrate Freedom/Doolittle Raiders

Grades 3-12 2 lessons 27 minutes Social Studies

Celebrate Freedom Education Day 2009 highlights the reunion of the Doolittle Raiders in Columbia, focusing on their heroic mission and the future. *Honoring Heroes-The 67th Doolittle Raiders Reunion*, produced by ETV's Mark Adams and his daughter Morgan, documents their experience of meeting the remaining Doolittle Raiders in 2009.

Congaree National Park

Grades 3-12 2 lessons 57 minutes Science/Environmental Ed

In **Project Discovery-Congaree National Park** naturalist Rudy Mancke takes students on a field trip to learn the history, experience champion trees and biodiversity, and talk about conservation of the largest remnant of old-growth floodplain forest remaining on our continent. ETV's **Roots in the River-The Story of the Congaree National Park** chronicles the history of SC's landmark from 1890s through struggles to preserve it and gain National status in 2003.

Creating a Career with the Arts in Mind

Grades 6-12 6 lessons 19–21 minutes Career Guidance/Arts

This series features eight SC artists – forensic artist, arts administration, interior design, printing, art therapy, painter, landscape art, graphic art – in a discussion about how the arts can be embedded in the 16 Career Clusters. They talk about career prep, what they do, and 21st century skills including innovation, problem solving, creativity, and critical thinking.

*Environmental Ed

Grades K-6 (Grade level expanded) 11 lessons 5 minutes Science/Environmental Ed.

These fast-paced programs challenge students with facts, investigations, questions, and Eco-quests to "leave no friend inside and carefully walk upon the earth." "Environmental Ed" welcomes students to his Nature Shack, inviting them to explore the world around them, learn about food chains, plant/animal survival, bio-diversity, pollution, conservation, recycling, green energy/technology, and more.

***NOTE:** Not all lessons are completed at this time.

Gettysburg National Military Park

Grades 4-12 4 lessons 60 minutes Social Studies

This series brings history to life. In one program, students find out whether historic value trumps property value as they follow a woman's journey with her teenage son to rediscover a battle and a speech that shaped a nation.

Gilbert Middle School Gives Flight to Veterans

Grades 3-12 1 lesson 30 minutes Social Studies

This program tells the story of Gilbert Middle School students honoring local veterans and sponsoring them to participate in an Honor Flight to see the memorial in Washington, DC and then the celebration upon their return.

Hurricane Hugo

Grades 3-12 **3 lessons** **27–60 minutes** **Science**

The “storm of the century” impacted animal and plant life in SC. Through these programs, including **Project Discovery-Lessons Learned from Hurricane Hugo** hosted by Rudy Mancke, students learn what a hurricane is, see Hugo’s path and hear about the physical/economic impact as we focus on the importance of being prepared.

Ice Age Discoveries

Grades 8-12 **2 lessons** **30 minutes** **Science**

Prince William Network (PWN) provides programs on recent archaeological discoveries and the science of archaeology. New discoveries in Virginia provide evidence that humans inhabited the area at least 18,000 years ago.

Palmetto Leaders – SCANS Skills

Grades 6-12 **13 lessons** **4–12 minutes** **Career Guidance**

These programs focus on the SCANS Skills that SC leaders identify as being instrumental in their career growth and success. Hear about problem solving with Chief Justice Toal, creativity with artist Jim Harrison, writing with Dr. Walter Edgar, teamwork with Coach Buddy Pough, and responsibility with Riverbanks Director Satch Krantz, plus others!

Reading, Safety & Internet Safety Minutes

Grades 6-12 **6 lessons** **3 minutes** **Language Arts/Safety**

Two 30-second programs provide a fun way to encourage older students to read for fun as well as for information. Four vignettes help students understand how to be safe at school, home and online. SROs talk about safe behavior.

****SC Aviation Association: Hall of Fame** (**Only in *StreamlineSC* – not broadcast)

Grades 8-12 **5 lessons** **8–11 minutes** **Social Studies**

Provided by SC Aviation Association, these programs focus on aviation in our Carolina skies, pioneering women aviators, aces of World War II, stories of South Carolinians in space, and the history of aviation in our state.

Searching for Life in Great Smokey Mountain National Park

Grades 3-8 **1 lesson** **60 minutes** **Science**

Provided by the National Park Service, this program explores the mountain ecosystem, discovers the abundance of life found there, and talks about interrelationships with the communities in the southern Appalachian Mountains.

Show and Tell Nature with Rudy Mancke

Grades 6-12 **12 lessons** **22–62 minutes** **Science/Natural History**

These Natural History programs, each about 45 minutes, give Naturalist Rudy Mancke the opportunity to share his in-depth knowledge on a variety of topics, including fossils, geology, skulls/bones, mountains to the sea, snakes, and insects. These lessons can be used with students in upper elementary through high school.

Take on the South

Grades 8-12 **2 lessons** **60 minutes** **Social Studies**

This is a series of debates produced by ETV for USC’s Institute for Southern Studies (ISS). Hosted by Dr. Walter Edgar, each features a debate between distinguished experts on a historical or current issues related to the South.

*Tune Up to Literacy

Grades Pre-K-3 **3 lessons** **2–3 minutes** **Literacy**

This series encourages literacy using original songs by composer/lyricist/educator Dr. Al Balkin, former Western Michigan Professor and composer who wrote music for *The Hobbit* as well as several off-Broadway children’s musicals. The programs musically introduce/reinforce concepts such as punctuation and sentence construction with songs like “Get the Point” and “Call on a Verb!”

Tyrone Geter Unveiled: A SC Artist and His Work

Grades 6-12 **2 lessons** **31–46 minutes** **Career Guidance/Arts**

Students meet renowned artist and Benedict College Art Professor Tyrone Geter to learn about his career as we visit his studio and also talk with him about his mural on contemporary slavery entitled *Look Beneath the Surface*. Each program is divided into segments.

- **Exploring Healthy Choices** (Grades 6-12, 6 lessons) – This series teaches students vital information concerning key areas of their health, including proper nutrition and suicide prevention. **Repeats Sept. 21, 11:45 a.m.–2:22 p.m. on channel 2.**
- **A History of Women's Achievement in America** (Grades 5-12, 8 lessons) – This series celebrates women's contributions to American history from the 17th century to present day. **Repeats Sept. 24, 9:00 a.m.–1:23 p.m. on channel 2.**

- **Connect with Kids At-Risk** (Grades 6-12, 6 lessons) – This series features true stories and real kids in peer-to-peer format that focuses on at-risk issues that kids face everyday to help teens with struggles and successes. **Repeats Sept. 29, 9:00-11:13 a.m. on channel 2.**
- **Great Campaigns of the Civil War** (Grades 6-12, 4 lessons) – This series uses realistic reenactments of the pivotal battles in the Civil War, along with letters, speeches and diaries to humanize the struggle. **Repeats Sept. 30, 12:50-2:48 p.m. on channel 2.**

Produced by the South Carolina Department of Education's Instructional Television (ITV) and South Carolina ETV in conjunction with Riverbanks Zoo and Garden, **Riverbanks Roundup** features educational aspects of the many wonderful animals, flora and fauna at Riverbanks. The science series is designed for grades K-6, but is proving popular with older students too since we all like to learn about animals and their habitats as we work to care for the world around us. Katie Mixon, Coordinator of Interpretive Programs at Riverbanks Zoo and Garden as well as a former teacher, is host of **Riverbanks Roundup**. Guests include Riverbanks Zoo curators and professionals who work with the many types of animals and who have vast knowledge of maintaining the thriving habitats.

Content Theme-based and Supports Science Standards

The content is designed to support South Carolina Science Academic Standards in grades K-6 such as Characteristics of Organisms, Animals, Habitats and Adaptations, Organisms and their Environments, and Ecosystems. **Riverbanks Roundup** programs each have a goal; are designed around themes; take in consideration of what students should know, feel and do after viewing; and also include conservation messages. We hope students will follow conservation tips given, visit a zoo and actually see the animals like the ones in the program and also e-mail their questions to **Riverbanks Roundup** to be answered by the experts. Conservation messages include how we as humans affect ecosystems and information about how responsible zoo and aquariums share knowledge, ideas and projects that empower people to take action.

Description of Sample Program - *Fact or Fiction*

Investigating zoo facts and zoo fiction is the focus as host Katie Mixon visits a Zoo aquarist to answer the question of whether piranhas are aggressive towards humans. Next, we head to the botanical garden growing center to discuss the eating habits of koalas. Exploring what is fact or fiction about an individual species dispels many myths about the characteristics of the plant or animal. Other inquiries are made concerning the age of the Galapagos turtles. A visit with reptile keeper gives the students a new understanding of venomous snakes. Questions concerning carnivorous plants are also addressed. A visit to the farm with a mammal keeper answers the question of why goats appear to eat anything and everything. The curious habits and reputations of many plants and animals are the basis for this interesting program!

The teacher's guide for each program contains a description of the content, vocabulary, classroom activities, standards correlations, and selected literature and Internet resources. Guides are posted online with the programs in *StreamlineSC*.

Idella Bodie's SC Women Series

NEW Programs . . . Look for programs about
Dorcas Richardson and Dr. Anne Austin Young coming in early 2011.
Schedule will be announced in February *ITV Update*.

Produced by ITV and ETV, the stories in this series are being adapted with permission and input from author Idella Bodie from her book *South Carolina Women*. Recommended to support social studies standards for South Carolina history for elementary and middle grade students, the programs are also good for use during Women's History Month with students in grades 3–12. Each dramatization tells the story of women who have shaped history and politics. They have been taped at historic sites and homes. A teacher's guide is available in *StreamlineSC*.

Program One – *Grace and Rachel Martin*

This is the story of two sisters-in-law living alone in the South Carolina back country who waylaid a British Courier with valuable papers by dressing up as colonial men. They risked their lives to stop the flow of information. Taped on location with historical costumes and artifacts, it takes place in the cabin considered to be the oldest frontier house still standing in SC.

Program Two – *Emily Geiger*

Emily is a young girl who risked her life by serving as a messenger for the Colonial army during the Revolutionary War. Captured by the British and interrogated as a spy, she managed to trick Lord Rawdon into believing she was innocent, outwitting her captors in a most unique manner. Taped in part at the actual location where the interrogation took place, this drama covers the story of Emily's journey from her assignment with General Greene to her release by Lord Rawdon.

Program Three – *Mary Chesnut*

Mary kept a diary during the turbulent times of the Civil War. This drama portrays various events in the life of the South Carolina heroine prior to and during the Civil War. The events dramatized are actual happenings that occurred to Mary and most of the words come straight from her diary. Mary actually spent time at Kensington Plantation, the location of the drama.

Program Four – *The Grimké Sisters*

Sarah Moore Grimké (1792-1873) and Angelina Emily Grimké (1805-1879), followed a similar path, speaking out about what they believed and leaving their home to join the fight for the causes of the abolition of slavery and equal rights for women. Today women are leaders in the community and in the business world, working along side their male counterparts in voicing and making their decisions, but it was not the same in the 1800's. These two sisters helped lead the way to change the course of history. From a young age they both stood up for what they believed were the wrongs of society. They spoke out against slavery, finding the courage to fight for their right to have a voice.

Program Five – *Wil Lou Gray*

Tells the story of Dr. Wil Lou Gray who began the South Carolina Opportunity School. The program follows her from the time that she was a young girl struggling with the loss of her dear mother through Dr. Gray's valiant efforts to get the Legislature to fund schooling for illiterate adults and children. Through reenactment of scenes in her life and interviews taped with Dr. Gray by ETV in the 1980's, we hear in Dr. Gray's own words her passion to help others to learn while we learn about what life was like during the early 1900's for many South Carolinians.

Program Six – *Mary McLeod Bethune*

This is the story of one woman's struggle to gain equality for herself and her students. The drama begins with Mary as a young child growing up in rural South Carolina and concludes with her hard work to start a school for African American students in Florida. The struggle that Mary encountered just to be given the chance to learn to read and then to teach others, including being threatened with bodily harm is shown. The drama shows how she started with nothing and ended up being an advisor to a President!

Program Seven – *Modjeska Simkins*

This is the story of an African American girl born to a half-white, half-black brick mason. She came from relative wealth and married into wealth, but dedicated her life to helping the disadvantaged to be treated equally. She was one of the organizers of the Supreme Court Case *Briggs Vs. Elliott*, which was the first filed of the four cases that later became combined *Brown vs. Board of Education*.

Program Eight – *Mary Gordon Ellis*

Mary Gordon Ellis was the first female to be elected to the South Carolina Legislature. This drama depicts her life from the challenges of being the school superintendent of Jasper County Schools where she addressed equality, making bold changes to impact education, to her time in office as an elected official until her untimely death at an early age.

Great for 4th and 5th Grades - Apply for a FREE Scholarship Through ITV*

The CWEFT programs use 21st century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a compelling learning experience for grades 4–8, using re-enactors to play the roles of historical figures. ITV offers one scholarship for each program.

***You are invited to apply to ITV for a scholarship for one CWEFT program in 2010–11.**

The scholarship for one program entitles your school to receive the excellent teacher materials and participate online/via telephone during the live program. You may also keep the recording of the program for the life of the tape. Apply now so your school will have a chance to be selected!

Now is the time to plan for using all the 2010–11 Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trips! Talk to your PTO about sponsoring the programs for next year. SC schools can receive all seven programs for around \$500. Though schools may view FREE and record programs with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate. By paying the fee, schools get teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors/historians online and via a toll-free number. 2010–11 Schedule:

- Oct. 14, 2010 *The Will of the People* – One of the most bitter presidential campaigns in U.S. History is part of a surprising lesson for a 21st-century student. Thomas Jefferson explains how negative campaigning, partisan politics and contested elections have been part of our political system since the earliest days of the republic.
- Nov. 18, 2010 *The Bill of Rights* (premiere) – The Bill of Rights protects individual freedoms, but what if the government had too much power and there was no such thing as the Bill of Rights? Explore an alternate reality in which individual rights are limited and life is very different.

Explore the excitement, peril and individual stories of Deborah Sampson, Mary Perth, Martha Washington, and other women on both sides of the conflict who proved their mettle in American War for Independence.

SC Healthy Schools is a partnership between the SC Department of Education and SC DHEC to improve students health and academic outcomes by increasing physical activity, improving nutrition and preventing tobacco use and HIV among elementary, middle and high school students. Resource is designed for administrators, teachers, school nurses, counselors, school health/wellness committee members, parents, community partners, and others interested in student health and academic achievement.

Working Together for Health and Learning: A Coordinated Approach to School Health (15:31)

To reach our academic goals, schools, families and communities must address the needs of the whole child. Using a coordinated school health approach, schools provide opportunities for students to learn and practice positive health behaviors so they can be fit, healthy and ready to learn! This program discusses the CDC coordinated school health model and how collaboration among the eight components - Health Ed; Physical Ed; Health Services; Nutrition Services; Counseling, Psychological and Social Services; Health Promoting Environment; Health Promotion for Staff; and Family/Community Involvement - can help students establish healthful behaviors and attitudes.

Nevitt Forest Elementary, Anderson School District Five (14:23)

Nevitt Forest partners with Palmetto Ag Consultants, the Anderson County Farmers Market, Clemson, and local farmers. Highlights the "Grow with Me" program-use of school gardens and integration of fresh fruits and veggies and nutrition ed throughout the academic curriculum.

Kelly Miller Elementary, School District of Fairfield County (12:56)

Highlights CATCH (Coordinated Approach To Child Health), a proven effective program that teaches students the importance of nutrition and physical activity. Working to address obesity, school staff and community discuss school activities such as Favorite Fruit Friday.

Manning Primary School, Clarendon School District Two (14:39)

Learn more about the planning, building and use of a 12-station fitness trail. Built by Manning High School students, the fitness trail is used by Manning Primary School teachers to incorporate physical activity into academic lessons and provides physical activity for the community.

Richland School District 2 (12:21)

Superintendent Stephen Hefner and district staff discuss the development and success of Commit to 2B Fit, a district-wide school employee wellness program. Nearly 800 district employees participated in the program and made the commitment to be healthy and fit.

R.B. Stall High School, Charleston County School District (15:46)

In an effort to reduce sexual risk behaviors among students, R.B. Stall and the Charleston Trident Urban League partnered to implement Safer Choices, a research-based, proven effective sexuality education curriculum. School staff and community partners discuss the benefits.

Drayton Hall Elementary School, Charleston County School District (17:17)

In an effort to improve student health, Drayton Hall Elementary adopted a variety of school health programs and practices. Featured activities include the Healthy Bobcat Club, Walk to School Day, incorporation of physical activity into classroom, and daily walks after lunch.

Wren Elementary School, Anderson School District One (7:44)

This segment focuses on how teachers at Wren Elementary are integrating physical education and SC history with "Pedaling Across the Palmetto State" activities. Students track their biking miles across the state and then receive a history lesson about where they "ride."

Bamberg School District Two (10:04)

Bamberg School District Two is proud of the success and national recognition they have received with Teen Life Center and implementation of comprehensive sexuality education at Denmark-Olar High School and Denmark-Olar Middle School.

Jennie Moore Elementary School, Charleston County School District (19:20)

Jennie Moore Elementary has developed a strong partnership with parents and community businesses to improve nutrition and increase physical activity among students. Highlights "Taste It Tuesday" and "Fitness Club" activities that happen with help from parents and local grocery.

Charleston Progressive Academy, Charleston County School District (7:16)

To increase physical activity among students, CPA began opening the gym for a morning physical activity period. As a result, the school has seen a dramatic reduction in discipline referrals and suspensions, as well as improved student concentration and focus in the classroom.

Mitchell Elementary School, Charleston County School District (13:50)

Mitchell has implemented a coordinated school health approach. District and school staff discuss ways to improve academics by incorporating physical activity into academic classes, utilizing a Fitness Room and Action Based Learning Lab and access to services.

Burke Middle/High School, Charleston County School District (8:45)

Community partnerships have proven to be valuable to Burke Middle/High School in their efforts to improve student health and academics. Learn about health-promoting activities made possible by partnerships with the Culinary Arts Program, The Lean Team, MUSC, and others.

R.B. Stall High School (Special Ed), Charleston County School District (14:37)

R.B. Stall High School recognizes the importance of physical activity for all students. After adding a daily physical activity period for special education students, teachers and staff have seen improvement in student engagement, interaction and cognitive skills.

Simpsonville Elementary School, Greenville County School District (8:49)

Greenville County Schools are implementing the Coordinated Approach to Child Health (CATCH) program in many of its elementary schools. Teachers and food service staff at this school have coordinated efforts to improve nutrition and increase physical activity among students.

Easterling Primary School, Marion School District Seven (10:35)

Coach Pete Ellis, administrators and staff at Easterling Primary discuss programs and activities they have implemented to create a health-promoting environment. Learn about the CATCH program, a staff wellness program and how these activities have benefited students and staff.

Richland County School District One (8:42)

Richland School District One in Columbia, SC adopted a 100% tobacco free policy on all school property. Their policy also requires using proven effective tobacco prevention curricula - in this case, Botvin *LifeSkills Training*.

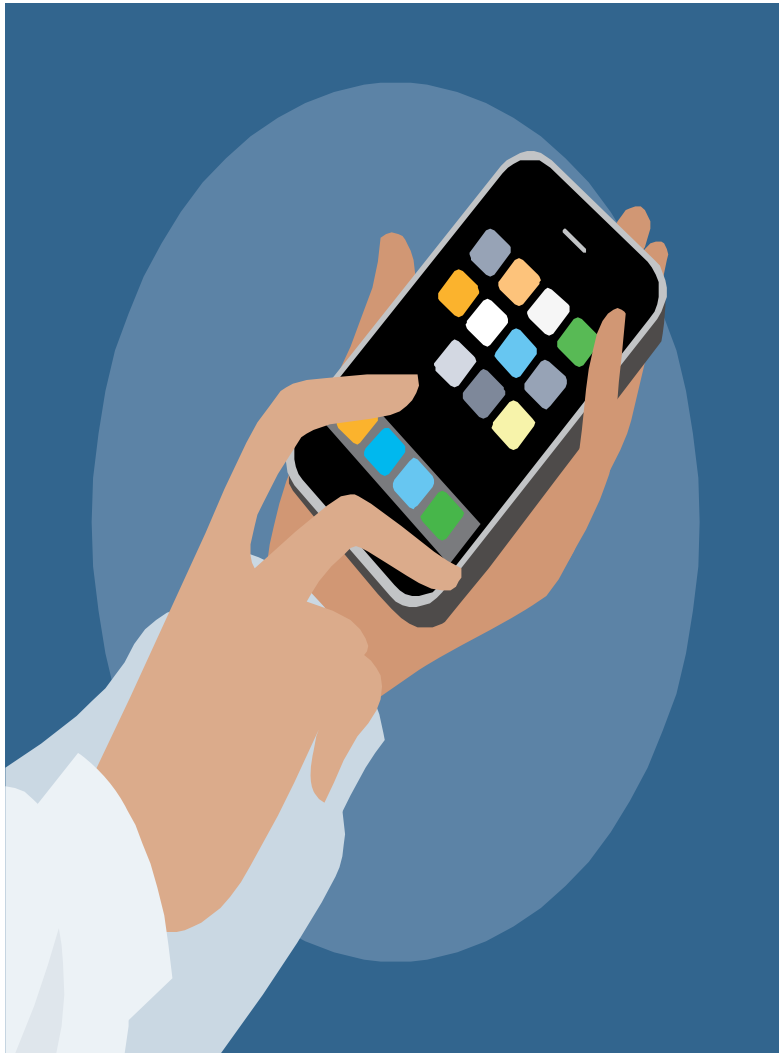

South Carolina ETV is strongly committed to the education of all South Carolina's children. It is our belief that learning begins at birth. In response, ETV began the READY TO LEARN initiative in South Carolina. **Kids love to learn.** PBS KIDS Raising Readers is a national literacy campaign, part of the Ready To Learn initiative, focused on building reading skills at home, at school, in child care, and in the community.

Funded by a Ready To Learn grant from the United States Department of Education, the Ready To Learn initiative has developed engaging PBS KIDS Raising Readers television programs, exciting games, playful Web sites, and easy-to-use learning resources for kids, parents, caregivers, and teachers — all with the goal of helping children ages 2 to 8 get ready to read.

All Ready To Learn initiative efforts incorporate the latest research about the most effective ways for kids to build reading skills, with a special emphasis on the needs of children from low income families.

The programs — *Between the Lions*, *Sesame Street*, *Super Why!*, *WordWorld*, *Martha Speaks*, and *Electric Company* — and related learning materials are based on the National Reading Panel's recommendations about the building-block skills needed for literacy, such as knowing letters and recognizing phonemes. PBS has also built an online amusement park, [PBS Kids Island](http://pbskids.org/read/), (<http://pbskids.org/read/>) where kids can play games based on the programs.

Recent research released by PBS KIDS Raising Readers and CPB prove the hit PBS KIDS series, SUPER WHY!, boosts literacy skills for preschoolers through interactive storybook adventures. The two new studies show that children, especially those from low income families, are learning core early literacy skills from the TV series and its educational engagement. **Children from low-income families who watched as few as two episodes of SUPER WHY! scored 46% higher on standardized tests than those who did not watch SUPER WHY!**

In addition to the Raising Readers literacy programming, ETV also broadcasts other well known PBS Kids and PBS KIDS GO! educational kids programs including new programs to support science learning for preschoolers . Programs like SID THE SCIENCE KID, DINOSAUR TRAIN and the new THE CAT IN THE HAT KNOWS A LOT ABOUT THAT! To supplement the TV series' lessons, an activity-filled websites will encourage kids to participate in character-driven exploration of science concepts on PBSKIDS.ORG. Additional parent and teacher resources will also be available on PBS Parents (PBSPARENTS.org) and PBS Teachers (PBSTEACHERS.org) sites. These sites will feature resources, tools and ideas, including example questions parents can use to help engage children as they explore the ideas sparked by the series.
